Boiler and Heating

As I am sure you are acutely aware, there has been an ongoing problem with the boiler that powers the underfloor/perimeter heating in the Church. It will be necessary to replace the boiler in the not-too-distant future. Quotes are currently being sought for more Eco friendly boilers which have the capacity for hydrogen adaptation when this becomes available. Fund raising will however be necessary to cover this extensive machine replacement and plumbing etc. To this end the Dona machines have an option to contribute to the work and there is now the facility to gift-aid your donation. Please do so if you possibly can. The Dona machine at the side entrance is set for the boiler appeal, whereas that at the back door location, is for normal offertory giving. This will hopefully ease congestion at the doors. There are also ad-hoc envelopes available in the church, which can be used for your donation and Gift Aid details. This would help enormously as we can then claim the tax back which greatly enhances the donation. I am sure the parish will respond in the generous way that it always has in the past, when such needs arise. Thank you.

Lenten Alms

One of the ancient practices of the Church during Lent is giving alms, that is, helping those less fortunate than ourselves. Bishop Declan stresses the need for this in his pastoral letter. I would suggest that contributing to our parish projects would be a great way of doing this. The most obvious cause is that of the people of the Ukraine during their time of need. Any money given during Lent via the parish project envelopes marked **Aid to the Church in Need** will be given to help those suffering as a result of the invasion of their home land. Another worthy cause would be to support Monze which assists the Parish of Our Lady of the Wayside. The parish there wants to create a large pond to grow Tilapia (which some regard as the fish that St. Peter caught with a shekel in its mouth). This project is expected to produce a significant income. 100 Tilapia fingerlings cost about £5 and, when they are sold could raise about £50. Donations should be placed in the Parish Projects envelopes, marked **Monze**.

The Chief Rabbi of Ukraine has asked for Christians to recite Psalm 31 aloud.

Psalm 31 21-24; 21 Praise be to the Lord, for he showed me the wonders of his love when I was in a city under siege. **22** In my alarm I said, "I am cut off from your sight!" Yet you heard my cry for mercy when I called to you for help. **23** Love the Lord, all his faithful people! The Lord preserves those who are true to him, but the proud he repays in full. **24** Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the Lord.

Laudato Si

The Department for Adult Education and Evangelisation is offering a six-part series on *Laudato Si*, the Papal Encyclical promulgated by Pope Francis in 2015. Jason Charewicz, the Caritas and Environmental Officer, will lead the sessions. The first three parts, called *Laudato Si: Into the Wilderness*, take place in Lent. The final three, called *Laudato Si: A New Creation*, take place during Eastertide. Each session will focus on a single chapter of *Laudato Si'* tied in with the liturgical season, providing an overview and invitation to dive deeper into the sections which call to you specifically. The encyclical will act as a focus for prayer and reflection to help discern the Lord's call in your life. This series is perfect whether you have never read *Laudato Si'* and want a prayerful introduction, or if you have read the document many times and seek a spiritual refreshment and refocus.
