DBS Renewals & Safeguarding Training

Several parish ministry volunteers are due for DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) renewals or need to complete safeguarding training in the coming months. If your DBS certificate is approaching its renewal date, or if your safeguarding training is due, the parish office will contact you directly with the necessary documentation and instructions. Staying up to date with these requirements is

essential for continuing your valued volunteer ministry within the parish. We appreciate your cooperation and commitment to maintaining a safe and welcoming environment for all. If you have any questions, please contact a member of the parish safeguarding team.

Gift Aid- Make your Giving Go Further

Many of our parishioners give generously to support the life and mission of our parish. If you are a UK taxpayer, you can make your donation go even further—at no extra cost to you—by signing up for Gift Aid. Through Gift Aid, we can claim an additional 25p for every £1 you donate from the Government. However, Gift Aid is only available to those who pay income tax and/or capital gains tax. Your donations will qualify as long as they are not more than four times the amount of tax you've paid in the tax year.

- If you already Gift Aid your donations, please review your tax status to ensure you remain eligible.
- If you don't currently Gift Aid, please consider doing so if your circumstances allow.

Brothers and Sisters: Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. For by it the people of old received their commendation.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went

out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.
